HOOP Lighthouses

HOOP is supporting 8 lighthouse cities and regions to implement technologies for the valorisation of the urban biowaste and wastewater. The lighthouses selected specific technologies and HOOP is helping them to develop solutions based on:

- Analysis of the urban metabolism of each lighthouse city and region and of the local context in terms of urban circular bioeconomy development
- C' The match of new circular business models with the needs of each lighthouse
- Technical and environmental assessment to select the best available technologies for each Lighthouse
- Innovative financial engineering and procurement


